



*How Can My SCHOOL Become
Designated
No Place for HATE®?*



1. Create a coalition to oversee the implementation of the anti-bias programs and projects in your school.

Members include administrators, teachers, staff, students, parents, and community leaders to oversee the implementation of the anti-bias programs and projects in the school.

2. Sign ADL's *Resolution of Respect* (found in ADL's *Positive Impact!* resource guide).

Organize a presentation of the *Resolution of Respect* to begin the program. One suggestion is making this part of a larger celebration of diversity, such as during an assembly, pep rally or individual classroom project. Sign the *Resolution of Respect* and display it in your school.

3. Complete three or more activities listed in ADL's *Positive Impact!* Resource guide's 101 Ways To Make A Positive Impact in Your Community.

Choose from the projects listed in *Positive Impact!* or be creative and design your own projects consistent with the program's theme.

4. Participate in one of the A WORLD OF DIFFERENCE® Institute training options:

- **Becoming An Ally: Interrupting Name Calling and Bullying** – (One Full Day) An interactive and participatory program which provides practical opportunities to engage students in exploring the harms of name-calling and bullying and to develop and practice skills to respond to incidents. (Students and/ or teachers and staff)

- **Peer Training** – (Two Full Days) Provides students with the training resources to design and lead interactive programs that contribute to respectful bias-free schools and communities. (Students only)

- **Trickery, Trolling and Threats: Understanding and Addressing Cyberbullying** – (Half or Full Day) Increases awareness about the unique features and impact of cyberbullying; provides strategies to respond effectively and fosters an increased culture of e-safety among youth. (Teachers, administrators, and student support personnel)

5. Complete and submit the Activities Fulfillment Forms to ADL, which are available online at regions.ADL.org/mountain-states.

Contact ADL or download the *School Request for Project Approval* and the *School Project Fulfillment* forms. First, send the *School Request for Project Approval* to ADL. When the project is complete, collect supplemental materials (press releases, photos, articles, etc.). Return the *School Project Fulfillment* form with these supplemental materials to ADL.

Upon completion of all three projects, the school will be designated a No Place for Hate® campus.
